### Challenges

- Designing for reuse and recyclability
- Developing / requiring extended producer responsibility
- Provision of Solid Waste Management services
- Identifying hot spots
- Lack of appropriate business case models for private sector involvement
- Lack of detailed socio-economic, strategic environmental and regulatory impact assessments
- Identification of appropriate and culturally acceptable alternatives



### Successes



- Creating and building partnerships with various stakeholders
- Creating harmonised approaches to
  - monitoring and collecting data –
  - developed with transboundary
  - cooperation (OSPAR Commission)

  - reduce plastics usage and improve
  - overall plastics management

- Developing campaigns to encourage
  - consumers to choose more sustainable
  - options and act at individual level to



## Feasibility & sustainability of action items

- Several Caribbean countries have implemented bans
- Increased interest in developing circular approaches
- Recognised importance of continued capacity building and multi-sectoral partnerships
- Importance of integrated approaches and stimulating new and green job opportunities
- Recognised role that regional agreements (Cartagena/LBS)
  Global Commitments (SDGs) and a new Global Legal
  Agreement could have in catalysing action
